ST. LOUIS – May 25, 2022 – Today, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Eastern Missouri announces its receipt of a donation of \$6 million from philanthropist MacKenzie Scott. This one-time, unrestricted gift is equivalent to the agency's annual operating budget of \$6.2 million. Scott's transformative donation will support the mentoring agency's investment in and commitment to partnering with young people in their pursuit of a meaningful, independent, and stable life.

Becky Hatter, CEO and President of BBBSEMO, states, "We are excited, honored and humbled by this generous gift. For decades our organization, represented by the Board of Directors, staff, parents, youth, volunteers, donors, and partners has been working to make a measurable impact in the lives of children and families. Our commitments to youth and families will only expand and intensify. We are eager to come together to imagine an even brighter future for all."

This generous gift comes at a time when the impact of mentorship for young people and the building of relationships are critical to society.
