

## Big Brothers Big Sisters. AMACHI MISSOURI 2022 BY THE NUMBERS

The aim of the Amachi program is to break the cycle of incarceration. Research shows that – without intervention – 70% of children with a parent in prison will end up serving time too. Mentorship can interrupt this painful cycle.

The Amachi mentorship program pairs a child with a caring adult mentor who listens, laughs, and learns alongside them. Core to the program is the belief that each child has unique needs and talents to be fostered.

**Amachi** is a West African word meaning "Who knows but what God has brought us through this child."
